Introduction • The World Health Organization attributes 4.9 million deaths a year to tobacco use, a figure expected to rise to >10 million by year 2030, if the current trend continues [1]. Almost 70% of these premature deaths will be in the developing countries, one third of which will be among children [2], making tobacco use a global epidemic.

How to Write a Rationale - NCTE

The word rationale appeared in the second half of the 17th century, just in time for the Age of Reason. It is based on the Latin ratio, which means "reason," and rationalis, which means "endowed with reason." At first, rationale meant "an explanation of controlling principles" ("a rationale of religious practices," for example), but soon it began to refer to the underlying reason for something (as in "the rationale for her behavior").

It is a very important part of your publication as it justifies the significance and novelty of the study. That is why it is also referred to as the justification of the study.
