Shaka had really no direct relationship with colonial powers. He did have individual relationships with traders, particularly those who took up at Port Natal (today Durban) with his permission. Most notable for historians was Henry Francis Fynn, but there were several others from whom he tried to leverage support in the troubled last years of his reign (and who tried to leverage their own).
