The record is maintained in a professional and legal fashion (i.e., organized, legible, concise, clear, accurate, complete, current, grammatically correct, and objective). “An occupational therapist shall document his or her ...

For example, a patient may address cognitive goals for sequencing as part of a speech-language pathology (SLP) treatment session while the physical therapist (PT) is training the patient to use a wheelchair, or a patient may address ADL goals for increasing independence as part of an occupational therapist (OT) treatment session while the PT addresses balance retraining with the patient to increase independence with mobility.

Guidelines for Documentation of Occupational Therapy

Examples of 97530 documentation (with key words in italics) include: 1. PT facilitated forward reaching activities at 90 degrees of shoulder flexion. Patient was given a 4 lb. on B wrists simulating item retrieval from shelves, placing the item on the floor and returning to the shelf.

Appropriate Use and Documentation of Therapeutic ...

Occupational therapy documentation provides a record of the practitioner’s ac-tivity in the areas of screening, evaluation and reevaluation, intervention, and outcomes (AOTA, 2014b) in accordance with practice guidelines and payer, facility, and state and federal guidelines and requirements.

Guidelines for Documentation of Occupational Therapy

Examples of good documentation to support homebound status: “After ambulating 20 feet, patient has increased dyspnea and complains of severe lower back pain. Must sit for 4 minutes before able to continue.” “Patient has unsteady gait, and must sit to rest for 7 minutes

Example: Non-skilled documentation: Observed patient brushing his teeth after set up with verbal cues. ... The occupational therapist provided verbal cues to instruct the patient in a compensatory strategy for using one hand to sequence squeezing the toothpaste onto the toothbrush, running the water and brushing the teeth with the appropriate ...
