The Rothko Chapel is a non-denominational chapel in Houston, Texas, founded by John and Dominique de Menil. The interior serves not only as a chapel, but also as a major work of modern art. On its walls are fourteen black but color-hued paintings by Mark Rothko.

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But the most important thing is, that on its walls you can find fourteen black but color hueed paintings by Mark Rothko. In 1964 Rothko was commissioned by de Menils to create a meditative space filled with his paintings. The works are site-specific, one of the requirements of the program.

ROTHKO CHAPEL. The Rothko Chapel, on Yuson Street and Sul Ross in Houston, was commissioned by Dominique and John de Menil. The building was originally conceived as part of Philip Johnson's campus design for the University of St. Thomas, but became an independent project when the Menils discontinued their association with that institution.

ROTHKO CHAPEL - The Authority on Texas History

At the beginning of 1964, Rothko started painting a number of black paintings containing dark hues and texture effects. The hues of the black paintings vary depending on the light intensity of that day so the paintings are different for every visitor that experiences them.
