Wildland tree planting (the most practical method of tree planting for reforestation) is done during dormant winter months, most often after December 15th but before March 31st. You may need to do it a little earlier or a little later in warmer or colder climates. Your nursery can help you decide.

How to Purchase and Prepare Trees for Planting

Proximity to structures and pavement. As trees grow, their roots can start to break apart patios, driveways, and sidewalks. They can also start growing into structures causing even more problems. Make sure to plant your tree at least five feet from pavement and 25 feet from structures.

Notch or slit planting with a garden spade is the quickest, but not the most reliable, method for

planting small trees. It is generally suitable for mass planting of bare-rooted transplants and whips under 90 cm (3ft) high. It should not be used in wet soil, for large or expensive trees or where failures must be minimised.

Planting arrangement refers to the pattern or distribution of tree and shrub species across a planting site. Planting the seeds directly in the ground is a great way to start the tree. You can also grow it in a biodegradable pot with organically rich, and sandy soil. To save time, you can also buy a well-grown plant from a nursery and directly plant it in your garden. This will save you 2-3 years that the plant takes when starting from seed.

Dig the planting hole two to three times the diameter of the tree's rootball and no deeper than the rootball itself. Since most Oklahoma soils are clay, plant trees one to three inches above grade. Plant trees at original grade in sandy soil. Do not put crushed stone or gravel in the bottom of the hole!

For trees in containers, gently slide the root ball out of the pot and into the hole. For burlapped trees, place the root ball in the hole and gently cut away the wire basket and burlap. Plant the tree so that the top of the root ball is flush with the top of the hole and the tree is vertical.

Tree Planting Guide - Tree Canada

Starting a lemon tree from seed is possible, but takes a while. Germination may take a long time, in some cases more than a month. Plant seeds at 1/2 inch deep, water well, and cover with ventilated plastic wrap to keep moist. Place in a sunny location.
